From Isaiah

- prose oracle (37:29–35; cf. 2 Kings 19:29–34)

- Hezekiah’s illness and recovery (38:1–22; cf. 2 Kings 20:1–11)
 - *Psalm of Hezekiah* (38:9–20; not in 2 Kings)
- His foolishness before the Babylonians (39:1–8; cf. 2 Kings 20:12–19)
